#### ***Superior-Greenstone DSB Appoints Charles Bishop as Assistant to the Director of Education***

In 1997 he received a Master's in Art (English) degree from Lakehead University and by 1999 he had completed an Honours Specialist in English from University of Windsor. Bishop also took Part 1 and 2 of the Principal's Qualification Course at Lakehead University; while from Queens University, he acquired a Curriculum and Instruction Basic Qualification in the Junior Division. Having worked through all the modules of the Supervisory Officers Qualification Program offered through the Ontario Principals' Council, Bishop's certification is pending completion of his practicum unit.

Upon his appointment Bishop said, "It is with great pleasure that I assume the role of Assistant to the Director with the Superior-Greenstone District School Board. I look forward to meeting staff, students, parents and other stake holders of the communities of the Board, so that we can work to together to inspire our students to succeed and make a difference."

In speaking of his experience as an education leader at Lakehead DSB, Bishops said, "I have had the good fortune to be involved in several committees and projects at the system level. Being part of Leadership Learning Teams as a Vice-Principal and Principal, and working on my problems of practice has afforded much insight into being an instructional leader in the schools, and has had a profound impact on my learning, most significantly learning to ask the right questions of others more often."
