## **Background**

Special Education Teachers provide support for students with many types of learning needs. Some of their responsibilities include: observation of students in order to support needs, support classroom teachers to make accommodations to student programs, work with school teams and parents to support student success, work with students to support various learning needs. We have had a continuous increase of special education needs across the district and our current Special Education Teacher staffing in many schools is in need of enhancement.

## **Current Situation**

Superior-Greenstone District School Board continues to fund the special education program above the amount allocated by the Ministry of Education through the SEPPA, the Special Equipment Amount (SEA) and the High Needs Amount (HNA). We currently have multiple students with high needs entering many of our schools in September. Our current proposal reflects supporting our students with high needs. SGDSB currently has 27% of the student population accessing special education support. Each year, we continue to have several students register mid year requiring significant supports and resources.

Currently we have seen increased need in Geraldton, Manitouwadge and Nipigon. Increasing our Special Education Teacher (SET) allotment at these schools would provide greater support for all students in the school as these teachers will have the ability to provide timely interventions as well as support the classroom teacher with effective accommodations for students with needs. These increases will also allow our Special Education teams (teachers, educational assistants, principals) to work collaboratively to improve learning outcomes and accessibility of the curriculum for all students with special education needs.

Increasing the SET role will also provide greater support for students with high needs and thus allowing us to apply for Special Incidence Portion (SIP) funding. This funding supports students who require additional supports beyond that of the classroom teacher and educational assistant.

It is recommended that for 2017-2018, 1.5 Special Education Teachers be funded through Board and Special Education Funding to support the learning needs of our students requiring special education.

The following chart outlines the proposed increases to Special Education Teacher staffing for the 2017-2018 school year.

## **Background**

Special Education resources including Special Education Resource Teachers, Educational Assistants, learning assessments and the special equipment purchases (Special Equipment Amount) continue to support students with special needs. In addition, Superior-Greenstone District School Board uses additional initiatives including Applied Behaviour Analysis, Autism Support, Safe Schools, Mental Health and other training opportunities to support students in our schools. In support of student well-being our Mental Health Lead and Mental Health and Addictions Nurse continue to work with our school administrators, teachers and support staff.

#### **Current Situation**

Superior-Greenstone District School Board continues to fund the special education program above the amount allocated by the Ministry of Education through the SEPPA, the Special Equipment Amount (SEA) and the High Needs Amount (HNA). We currently have multiple students with high needs entering many of our schools in September. Our current proposal reflects supporting our students with high needs. SGDSB currently has 27% of the student population accessing special education support. Each year, we continue to have several students register mid year requiring significant supports and resources.

Currently 51 FTE Education Assistants (EAs) support students in our schools, 42.0 have been funded through Board and Special Education funding, 6.0 have been funded through First Nation tuition agreements; and 3.0 funding through invoicing.

It is recommended that for 2017-2018, 42.0 41.0 EAs be funded through Board and Special Education Funding and an additional 6.0 7.0 Educational Assistants be funded through First Nation tuition agreements for a total of 48 Educational Assistants.

The following chart outlines the proposed Education Assistant staffing for the 2017-2018 school year.

#### **Background**

As part of the extension agreements reached with several groups, the Ministry has provided Local Priorities money and in order to spend these funds, boards are to consult with federations

For our board, funding received under Local Priorities is as follows:

#### Current Situation

We have had discussions with our federation representatives regarding the use of Local priorities funding for 2017/18.

Following our discussions with Elementary Teachers' Federation (ETFO), we are recommending that this funding support the addition of 0.5 FTE Special Education Teacher at Schreiber Public School. This aligns with our rationale for changes to special education teacher staffing in our elementary schools.

At this point, we are still in discussion with our secondary teachers represented by OSSTF and will bring forward a proposal later.

Because of our discussion with OSSTF Support staff, we are recommending the following:

- The addition of a 1.0 FTE Child and Youth Worker at Geraldton Composite High School in order to support students at that school.
- The addition of 0.5 FTE to secretarial support at Nakina Public School in support of safe schools /safe arrivals initiatives. This is the only elementary school without a full time secretary position.
- The addition of 1.0 FTE Educational Assistant position to support within the system.
