7.1 Showcasing Learning: Margaret Twomey Public School - Moose Camp Video

The Director of Education Nicole Morden Cormier introduced the Showcasing Learning video that highlighted the partnership between SGDSB. Anishinabek Education System and Biigtigong Nishnaabeg. The moose camp teachings provided students with cultural awareness, understanding and experiential learning. The teachings included how to harvest a moose, proper cutting techniques, land based learning and how to honour the land.

7.2 Excellence in Education: Nakina Public School: Maybe It's All About The Small Things Principal Bev Vachon provided the presentation that highlighted the school spirit and sense of belonging fostered at the Nakina Public School. The presentation included introductions for the newest members of the "wolf pack", new ideas anchored in the four pillars of the board multi-year strategic plan, student engagement activities and the teaching of indigenous ways of being imbedded in to the school and honouring the traditions of the Anishinabek.

Student Trustees Erin Couture and Grace Molinski presented their report that highlighted their work to organize and host the Student Trustee Information Panel. Former Student Trustees where invited to speak about their experience and offer advice regarding the Student Trustee role. The initiatives include developing capacity through training to ensure the board is implementing practices and supports in Applied Behaviour Analysis that are values-based, compassionate, and
