Multi-Disciplinary Team Update 5.5

Sara Curtis

S. Curtis' update focused on SEA claims through our district where all items purchased are specific to student need and require a referral from an outside organization to enable a student to access curriculum. SEA claims go through S. Curtis then the board for processing. Within our district, the areas we are supporting are as follows:

Sensory items, sensory room items: \$94,000

Physical need support (change tables, tricycles, adjustable chairs/desks, toys): \$49,000

Communication support (fm systems, associated software): \$6,700

Technology (note: this has decreased over the last few years), includes iPads, laptops: \$10,000

- W. Goodman added that a lot of students are using laptops and that the board has put many into the system for grade 5 and 9 students (new in high school as an older laptop would not meet requirements for REM and internet); that they're accessible by everyone (not just spec ed students).
- M. McIntyre asked if the laptops for Gr 5 & 9 were made through the board and not a grant; W. Goodman confirmed that this was correct.
- M. McIntyre asked if the laptops are specialized (for vision/speech problems), with S. Curtis advising that it is the software and specific packages that are the differentiating piece, not the laptop, and that Google Read&Write allows access to specific learning.
- M. McIntyre inquired as to how referrals work, through a family or us? Generally, referrals come from us, but family often supports, and reports are submitted with the school and family highlighting / identifying equipment for SEA applications.

5.6 SGDSB Spec Ed Data

- W. Goodman advised that a report with data similar to the provincial data will provided at the next SEAC, allowing comparisons to be made. Our data will show our population but will be generic enough to not single out individuals, we will see context and it will help us understand our needs.
- P. Cormier inquired as to whether it's possible to see if there is any overlap with this and first nations data and where funds come from, with others commenting that this would be interesting to see if this is possible.
