	For the 2020-21 school year most of our programs will be offered online, but to all students with ASD. We are partnering with indigenous portfolio, based out of GCHS (percussion & guitar) and will review and hope to continue if funds allow. For children with ASD, 'stronger together' program will be facilitated by a GJCC therapist & M.Bianco. This is very different from our community-based programs due to Covid-19 and we are hoping for a positive outcome for our kids who are on the spectrum.						
	M.McIntyre: impressed with plans, and the positivity is to be applauded and added that she is thrilled that music is returning to the schools.						
	M.Mannisto added that the logistics must be incredible, hats off to the team since this cannot be easy to do when most things are face-to-face; a different challenge. M.Bianco indicated that our pivot is based a lot on feedback from families and children with autism; with mental health being important.
