# 8.1.1 Pupil Accommodation: Viability Study-August 2001

Before addressing the report at hand, Director H. Wilson-Boast referred to the Lake Superior High School as related to the Pupil Accommodation Viability Study submitted to the Board in August 2001. This report brought forward the recommendation from the Board to have administration launch the Lake Superior High School Dual Campus Review using the process outlined in the Pupil Accommodation Policy No. 905. The Township of Schreiber disputed the ensuing study and the decision taken by the Board on March 22, 2002 to locate

Lake Superior High School in Terrace Bay. On August 20, 2002, Justice L.C. Kozak heard the case in the Ontario Superior Court of Justice (Divisional Court). His decision in the judicial review, handed down on Friday, August 23, 2002 finds that the Board did not breach its duty of procedural fairness in arriving at its decision to close the Schreiber Campus and dismissed the application.

### 8.1.2 Pupil Accommodation: Viability Study-August 2002

Senior Administration in accordance with the Pupil Accommodation Policy 905 conducted the Pupil Accommodation Viability study over the summer. The viability study notes that our Board has several emerging issues in regard to excess capacity in many of our schools. The excess exists in virtually all schools, however distance between communities, long transportation times to new school locations and the importance of maintaining a school in the community make school closures prohibitive

Administration was directed to commence the process to organize a study committee to investigate the kindergarten to Grade 12 concept. Trustee L. Aylward suggested that an invitation be extended to the Superior North Catholic DSB and Conseil Scolaire du District du Grand Nord de l'Ontario to meet with the Board to discuss opportunities for sharing space in small communities.
