

P. Pella provided an overview of the process to date. Best Start is a government initiative to expand day care spaces in Ontario through community hubs that were to be closely aligned with area schools. Boards in Northwestern Ontario have met extensively to delineate a coordinated proposal. However, ministry officials are now suggesting it is possible that Year 2 and 3 funding, which is the focus of SGDSB proposal could be cancelled. The ministry's revised approach is expected on or about March 21, 2006.

P. Pella provided a comprehensive verbal report in reference to Report No. 17, noting that earlier this year, Senior Administration had, and as requested by the Board explored the financial implications of providing a Full Day JK Program for students in the Superior-Greenstone DSB. The results indicated the program would be revenue neutral. Following this, a consultation with stakeholders, namely, the parents, teachers, staff and community members to determine the level of support for a full-day JK was done in the form a survey distributed to each elementary school and the school principal. It was made available to above stakeholders and school council members. The survey results consolidated in the report were followed by a variety of considerations for the board. The Board discussed a variety of pros and cons. The status quo will be maintained for the 2006-2007 school year. If a move is made toward full-day JK, trustees agreed it would be a pilot program not done until the 2007-2008 school year.

It gives school boards the responsibility of determining the number of trustees they can have on their board based on the principle of representation by population, as well as the geographic area each of their trustees will represent. Calculations generate the number of trustee positions as eight which is identical to the distribution in the November 2003 Municipal Election.
