6.1 Ministry Approval of 2014-2015 School Calendar

SGDSB working with co-terminous board to co-ordinate bussing, P.D. (same days: Sept. 2, 26, Oct. 24/ 2014, Jan. 30, April 24, and June 8/2015). This will be brought forward to the February 24th Board Meeting to be approved. Once approved the 2014-2015 Board Calendar will be posted on our website.

6.2 Mental Health Staff Needs Survey

D. Tamblyn reported 144 respondents on the Student Survey. One of the results that stood out from the survey: is a concern with a student's *sense of belonging*.

Results from the staff survey indicated 100% extremely concerned with achievement and well-being of our students.

Student absenteeism and inability to concentrate and focus at school stood out.

The teaching staff expressed a concern of not being equipped to deal with mental health issues.

A survey will be sent out this spring to see any changes or how to address issues.

N. Petrick reported student survey was sent out last spring on School Climate and Safe School.

The results of the survey are to be released, electronically on Board website, last week in February. A Parent Survey will be released in the spring, (completely anonymous), in which five key areas are being addressed:

- 1. Two-way communication with parents.
- 2. Parent support learning at home.
- 3. Parent participation at school.
- 4. How School Supports Learning.
- 5. Does the school support child's behavior?

<u>Tell Them From Me</u>: survey was Board wide and broken down per school. The information was collated and will be available on Board website. An open discussion followed.

Asmussen, Principal, has challenged all the schools within S.G.D.S.B. building snow sculptures.

<u>Marathon</u>: Cooper reported coupons for board game/cooking as family will run until after March Break. Pancake Breakfast at Christmas (invited Tamblyn and Marathon Mayor) and continuing with Fun Nights. Hot Chocolate days continue, this has been well received with the cold day's we've been experiencing.

<u>Manitouwadge</u>: Bake Sale and Spaghetti Lunch to celebrate/promote *Literacy Day* at Public School. The high school is continuing with fundraising for Bursaries in June, Bottle Drive to purchase sport uniforms, celebrate Teacher Appreciation Day in May, extra-curricular activities, post Parent Council Minutes in school and send home electronically, and volleyball event with parents.

Nakina: They continue with fundraising: Bake Sale/Bottle Drive as well as co-operating with other schools.
