#### 4.2 Peers Helping Peers (follow-up from last meeting)

- Peers Helping Peers program was the starting point for the Youth Mental Health Champion program at the Nip-Rock High School. A pilot project for secondary schools.
- The Youth Mental Health Champion program is a partnership between Registered Nurses Association of Ontario and Public Health Unit. The concept was to engage students in mental health activities, things that would be student driven to improve the student body.
- Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> A team went to Toronto for training; 4 students were from Nipigon along with a teacher and a Health Nurse.
- Students received certificates and accommodations from the Registered Nurses of Ontario and Thunder Bay Public Health Unit.
- This does align with the Safe Talk program.
