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2.0 Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was opened with a song and prayer. Introductions where provided for the new committee members.

3.0 Approval of the Minutes

4.0 Smudging Pamphlet Revisions – Follow up

Indigenous Education Lead Nancy O'Donnell provided an update regarding the Smudging Pamphlet. She advised that with the feedback received from the committee, the pamphlet has been revised to reflect the suggested changes. She provided a review of the process that has begun to implement and communicate the smudging guidelines as outlined in the pamphlet to staff, Students and Parents.

5.0 Indigenous Trustee Update

Director of Education Nicole Morden Cormier provided an update regarding the status of the vacant roll of Indigenous Trustee. She advised that Paul Cormier has been nominated for the role. At this time, the Board is awaiting responses from the First Nations communities with whom they hold Education Service Agreements, to collect their vote for the nomination. If Paul is the selected candidate, he will be officially appointed as Trustee at the September or October Board meeting and will also assume the role of Indigenous Education Advisory Committee Chair.

6.0 Celebrating Success in the District

Ms. O'Donnell provided a detailed review of the successful initiatives and the achievements Students have had across the Superior-Greenstone District School Board. She noted the following highlights:

- An Ojibway Language Teacher has been appointed for our schools in both Geraldton and Longlac.
- In the Spring, students requested drums and hand drums so that they could begin drumming in class weekly. A ceremony was held to feast the drums and students from the High School drum group have visited the public school class to assist them in learning how to drum. The class is currently looking for male and female singers to join them in song.
- The student drum group from Longlac have named their group the "Water Warriors" and the Geraldton group has yet to name their drum.
- The George O'Neill Public School have been learning about their language through teachings about traditional medicines. Students harvested bark for the activity completed by the class.
- In partnership with the Red Rock Indian Band, Teacher Shy-Anne Bartlett extended the medicine teachings in to the classroom beginning this fall.
- Currently the Board is monitoring the effectiveness of the Indigenous Grad Coach
 position for student success. To date, success has been seen as an overall increase in
 credit accumulation, increased engagement with classroom teachers, increased
 communication with home and community.
- Working with the Indigenous Graduation Coaches, the Board would like to establish an Indigenous Youth Council.



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7.0 Board Action Plan – Seeking Input for 2019/2020

Ms. O'Donnell provided a PowerPoint presentation to assist in her review of the Board Action Plan. She reviewed the draft document in detail and invited Committee feedback. The committee members provided in depth input and recommendations such as the increase in transition activities, initiatives to increase parent engagement, facilitate/provide professional development opportunities for teaching staff to assist them in incorporating culturally appropriate pedagogy into practice, student well-being surveys and an increase in Grad Coach positions across the district. Ms. O'Donnell will provide the Committee with the plan once finalized.

8.0 Additional Items

Ms. O'Donnell requested Committee members to share the names of children's books from Indigenous Authors and recommended resources for teaching students about Treaties, as well as Orange Shirt Day.

9.0 Schedule of Meeting Dates:

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 28, 2020. The SGDSB Trustees will be reviewing/approving the 2020 meetings schedule at their December 2nd organizational meeting and therefore the tentative date may change. The 2020 meeting dates will be sent out after the December Board meeting.
