### Background Information

## Selection Criteria

Each of the following *may* be taken into consideration:

- Academic achievement and/or standing
- Social identity, socio-economic status or other factors unique to each student's achievements and the opportunity available to them
- Contribution to their community through extracurricular/volunteer activities
- Students enrolling in an education or early childhood education program
- Students pursuing Trades or Technical Studies
- Students enrolled in a second language program
- Students pursuing Indigenous studies.

(\*The scholarship must be awarded to a graduating student)

## Public Property Assessment Network Scholarship

### *Application Process*

Applicants are asked to explain in a **maximum** of 300 words their suitability for the Public Property Assessment Network Scholarship based on the established criteria.

All applications must be accompanied by two letters of reference, one of which must be from the principal or principal designate on school letterhead. Letters of reference should not exceed two pages in length. (\*Note any additional materials/letters and/or submissions beyond the word limit will **not be taken into consideration.**)
